	Bike Rodeo: For all Cub Scouts who participate in a pack or district sponsored bike rodeo. See Council for an information packet.		Boys' Life: For any Cub Scout whose pack is 100% Boys' Life (one subscription per family).		Raingutter Regatta: For all Cub Scouts who build & race a boat in a pack-organized raingutter regatta.
	Day Camp: For any Cub Scout attending a week-long day camp experience.		Eagle (Youth Protection): For all youth who view "A Time To Tell" with their unit.		Pinewood Derby: For all Cub Scouts who build & race a car in a pack-organized Pinewood Derby event.
	Learn To Swim: For all Cub Scouts who successfully complete a pack learn to swim program.		Anniversary: For all Cub Scouts who participate in a pack-organized activity that displays Scouting to the public during the anniversary period (February of each year).		Space Derby: For all Cub Scouts who build & race a Space Derby rocket in a pack-organized event.
	Physical Fitness (Cub Scout Olympics): For any Cub Scout who participates in a pack-organized Olympics using the national guidelines on the five (5) required events.		National Summertime Pack Award: For Cub Scouts whose pack has met the requirements for National Summertime Pack Award (see charter packet).		Kite Derby: Available to all Cubs who build & participate in a den or pack sponsored kite derby.
	Recruiter - Hi! Segment: For any Cub Scout responsible for bringing a new Cub Scout into the program.		Scoutcapades: For any Cub Scout who participates in the annual Scoutcapades show.		Tree Plant: For Scouts who participate in the council-sponsored Tree Plant.
	Scouting For Food: For all Cub Scouts who participate in the council's annual Scouting For Food drive.		Goodwill/Good Turn: For boys who participate with their pack in the annual council Goodwill/Good Turn activity.		Helping-Seeing: For Webelos Scouts who participate in a special activity with a local Boy Scout troop.
	Webelos Camporee: For any Webelos who participates in a district Webelos Camporee or district Scout Camporee with a Webelos program.		Webelos Campout: Available to Webelos Scouts who participate in a den or pack-organized parent/son campout.		Resident Camp: For Cub Scouts attending the resident camp experience.
	Unit Activity: Available to all Cub Scouts for a special den or pack activity approved by the pack & not covered by another segment.

	Zoo Fun: Visit the Oregon Zoo, Portland, Oregon.		OMSI Search: Visit the Oregon Museum of Science & Industry (OMSI), Portland, Oregon.		Barlow Trail: Hike at least two miles of the Old Barlow Trail, near Highway 26 to Government Camp.
			Winter Activity: Take part in a wintertime activity such as innertubing, skating, or sledding.		








Big Adventure Segments -- Intermediate

	Fort Vancouver: Visit the Fort Vancouver Museum & tour the historic fort. Vancouver, Washington.		Ape Caves: Visit the Ape Caves & hike to the end of the South lava tube or hike the North loop (overland). The North tube is off limits. Read or listen to the story of the Ape Caves. Ariel, Washington.		Magness Tree Farm: Visit & tour the Magness Tree Farm.
			Multnomah Falls: Visit Multnomah Falls and hike the loop trail from Wakeena Falls to Lookout Point (approximately two miles). Near I-84 in the Gorge.		

Big Adventure Segments -- Advanced/2nd Year Webelos

	Whale Watch: View a tape-show of whale watching at any of the coast state parks/private camps. Watch for whales. Oregon/Washington Coasts.		Silver Creek Falls: Camp at the state park's cabins or tent sites. Hike at least one of the loop trails to the falls. Visit the museum. Silverton, Oregon.		Butte Creek Horse Trip: Visit the Butte Creek Camp and go through the orientation. Take a horse ride of at least two hours (arranged through the council office). Near Molalla, Oregon.
			Fort Clatsop: Visit the museum/headquarters and tour the Fort. Hike at least two miles of the Lewis & Clark Historic Trail. Astoria, Oregon.

	Hiking I: For beginning hikers. Short, non-demanding hikes. For Wolves and Bears.		Hiking II: More difficult, challenging hikes. More appropriate for Webelos.		Science & Nature Weekend: A trip to discover our world. For example, visits to wildlife refuges, a park, a fish hatchery, or a recycling center.
	Art & Music Appreciation: To introduce boys to the arts and music. For example, a visit to the county fair, Artquake (Portland, Oregon), the Portland Art Museum, or a theater performance.		Northwest History: Experience the history of our great Northwest. For example, visit museums, historic houses or ferry rides.		Living Service: Adopt a shut-in, visit a nursing home. Brighten someone's life.
